about the peculiarities of holding entrance examinations for citizens with disabilities during admission for training on programs of a specialist degree to the federal state budgetary educational institution of higher education "Dagestan State Medical University" of the Ministry of healthcare of the Russian Federation and the rules of their holding in 2020/21 academic year.

The federal state budgetary educational institution of higher education "Dagestan State Medical University" of the Ministry of healthcare of the Russian Federation (hereinafter – the University) provides the holding of entrance examinations for students from among persons with disabilities and (or) disabled people (hereinafter together-applicants with disabilities), taking into account the peculiarities of their psychophysical development, their individual capabilities and health status (hereinafter-individual concerns).

The University has created material and technical conditions that ensure the possibility of unimpeded access to the classrooms, toilets and other rooms for people with disabilities, as well as their staying in these rooms.

The entrance examinations for citizens with disabilities are held in a separate classroom.

The number of applicants with disabilities in one classroom should not exceed 12 people.

It is allowed to have a larger number of applicants with disabilities in the classroom during the entrance examination, as well as to hold entrance examinations for applicants with disabilities in the same classroom together with other applicants, if this does not create difficulties for applicants while passing the entrance examination.

It is allowed to have an assistant from among the University employees or involved persons present in the classroom during the entrance examination, who provides the necessary technical assistance to applicants with disabilities, taking into account their individual needs (to take a workplace, move around, read and formalize the task, communicate with teachers which are holding an entrance examination).

The duration of the entrance examination for applicants with disabilities is increased by the decision of the admission Committee of the University, but not more than 1.5 hours.

Applicants with disabilities are provided with information about the procedure of holding the entrance examinations in a form that is accessible to them.

Applicants with disabilities can use the technical facilities which are necessary for them due to their individual characteristics during the entrance examination.

While holding entrance examinations, the following additional requirements are met, depending on the individual characteristics of applicants with disabilities:

1) for the blind:

tasks for the entrance examination are made out in raised-point dot Braille or in the form of an electronic document that is accessible by using a computer with specialized software for the blind or read out by an assistant;

written tasks are performed on paper in raised-point Braille or on a computer with specialized software for the blind or are dictated to an assistant;

if it necessary applicants are provided with a set of writing materials and paper for writing in Braille, as well as a computer with specialized software for the blind;

2) for the visually impaired:

individual uniform illumination of at least 300 Lux is provided;

if necessary, applicants are provided with magnifying device for making the task; it is also possible the use of their own magnifying devices;

tasks for implementation, as well as the instructions on the procedure for holding entrance examination are made in an enlarged font;

3) for the deaf and hard of hearing:

the presence of sound-amplifying equipment for collective use is provided if necessary the sound-amplifying equipment for individual use is provided;

sign language interpreter services are provided;

4) for the deaf-blind, the services of a tactile interpreter are provided (in addition to the requirements that are met for the blind and deaf);

5) for persons with disorders of the musculoskeletal system, disorders of motor functions of the upper limbs or lack of upper limbs:

written tasks are performed on a computer with specialized software or dictated to an assistant;

all entrance examinations can be held orally at the request of applicants.

The listed conditions are provided to applicants on the basis of an application for admission which contains information about the need to create the appropriate special conditions.
